

Canadian Navigable Waters Act

The Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) hereby gives notice that an application has been made to the Minister of Transport, pursuant to the *Canadian Navigable Waters Act* for approval of the work described herein and its site and plans.

Pursuant to paragraph 7(2) of the said Act, RDN has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Navigable Waters Registry (<http://cps.canada.ca/>) under Registry number 5049, and under the NPP File Number 2022-506143 a description of the following work, its site and plans:

- A beach nourishment project consisting of cobble fill and four rocky headlands that will be installed to protect an exposed section of the RDN interceptor pipeline. The project footprint is in the upper intertidal zone (above the mean water level) and will extend to the base of the bluffs.

on the foreshore of the beach, east of Oar Rd and to the north of Seabold Park Stairs. Coordinates of the work are at approximately 49.248 °N and -124.054 °E.
