# Mayfair Neighbourhood Traffic Calming Review











## Background

- Staff has received traffic safety concerns from residents throughout the Mayfair neighbourhood.
- Traffic studies were conducted to determine what traffic improvements are warranted.
- This Neighbourhood Traffic Plan was developed to address the safety concerns, consistent with the city's traffic regulations policy.
- The plan is now being presented through Let's Talk Brantford to receive feedback from the neighbourhood before presentation to City Council for approval.

# Neighbourhood Wide Recommendations



- Speed Limit Reduction
- 40km/h Area Speed
- 30km/h School Zone
- Include Kent Road and Olivetree Road to the rotation list for the temporary installation of digital speed signs












#### Oxford Street – at Olivetree Road

- Improve east leg of intersection alignment with Pedestrian Crossover










### Deerpark Avenue – Speed Cushions



 Install Speed Cushions










#### Deerpark Avenue – at MacDonald Crescent

## How do we implement?

Step 1 – Residents identified locations of concern and suggestions on how to address.

Step 2 – Traffic Services staff reviewed the concerns and developed a traffic management plan based on city policy and industry principles.

Step 3 – Present Traffic Plan to the neighbourhood through Let's Talk Brantford and receive feedback (we are here) Follow-up review / traffic studies as required.

Step 4 – Report to Committee of the Whole – Operations with recommendations (early 2026)

Step 5 – City Council approval / implementation (2026 / 2027, subject to funding approval)
