Land Acknowledgement

The City of Hamilton is situated upon the traditional territories of the Erie, Neutral, Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee and Mississaugas. This land is covered by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, which was an agreement between the Haudenosaunee and Anishinaabek to share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes. We further acknowledge that this land is covered by the Between the Lakes Purchase, 1792, between the Crown and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.

Today, the City of Hamilton is home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (North America) and we recognize that we must do more to learn about the rich history of this land so that we can better understand our roles as residents, neighbours, partners and caretakers.



Recreation Master Plan



Recreation Master Plan

The **goal of the Master Plan** is to ensure the City's recreation portfolio is responsive to needs in a manner that is responsible, equitable and cost-effective.

This is a **long-range study** that looks at Recreation needs across the entire City of Hamilton.

The Plan guides future decision-making. Facility needs have been identified to 2051, though the primary **emphasis is on the next 10 years**. Service directions are also provided for a 10-year timeframe.

The Plan contains **85 recommendations**, divided into short (10yrs), medium (10-20yrs), and long-term timeframes (20+yrs).



Community Recreation Centre Recommendations



Westmount Recreation Centre

Short-term recommendations include:

Prepare a Community Recreation Centre Renewal and Redevelopment Strategy to guide major reinvestment in existing facilities.

Establish 3 new growth-related Community Recreation Centres by 2031

- Waterdown: pool, gym, program space
- Glanbrook/Binbrook: gym, program space
- Fruitland-Winona: gym, program space.

Proposed Project: Waterdown

Recommendation to Establish a new growth-related CRC in


• Waterdown (short-term) – gym, pool, program space (Harry Howell Arena site)

Provision Model

- Facility designs that are inclusive, multi-use, accessible, and resilient will be promoted.
- Each CRC should be anchored by a public indoor pool and/or gymnasium and contain multiple spaces for programs, activities and gatherings.
- Modern pool designs include multiple tanks with different water temperatures, universal change rooms, and barrier-free accessibility.



PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE GOAL

To share information and **gather community feedback to inform the following**:

- Proposed Vision Statements for CRC design and development.
- Proposed Guiding Principles Related to CRC design and development.
- **Prioritize facility spaces** within the proposed Waterdown CRC and identify gaps.
- Prioritize additional accessibility features to include within the proposed Waterdown CRC and identify gaps.
- Confirm preferred building aesthetics related to CRC design and development.



Public Information Centre - Visioning Results

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

- High level of support for both Vision and Guiding Principles across all PICs.
- Not all attendees chose to participate in the PIC survey or answered in "groups".
- Consistent high priority for Gymnasiums, Pools, Multi-use Spaces and Indoor Tracks.
- Consistent high priority for beach access pools, gendered AND universal change areas.
- Lower response rates to accessibility questions.
- Consistent Eco-Friendly/Sustainable and Nature Inspired aesthetics preferred.

The following **VISION** statements describe facility aspirations and objectives regarding Recreation building design with total respondent level of agreement. (9 PIC engagements)

VISION STATEMENT	AGREE	SOMEWHAT AGREE	DO NOT AGREE
To create a dynamic and inclusive community recreation centre that provides a broad spectrum of high-quality services and programs, accessible to all. (n=87)	98%	2%	
By fostering equity, inclusivity, and opportunity, we aim to create a space where everyone, regardless of background or ability, can thrive. (n=78)	97%	3%	
Financial sustainability will guide the City's efforts to ensure the long-term viability and success of the recreation centre, to continue delivering exceptional services for years to come. (n=75)	87%	11%	3%



The following **GUIDING PRINCIPLES** provide a framework to guide facility design considerations with total respondent level of agreement. (9 PIC engagements)



Provide opportunities for community connections and socialization. (n=83)	94%	6%	
Prioritize sustainable and green elements. (n=80)	68%	31%	1%
Accessible, inclusive, barrier free design to facilitate participation for all ages, stages, abilities and needs. (n=83)	98%	2%	
High quality, multi-functional and flexible spaces to support a spectrum of recreation services. (n=80)	96%	4%	
Provide a safe and welcoming space for all members of our community. (n=73)	97%	3%	
Space to maintain active, healthy and connected lifestyles in a sport friendly facility. (n=79)	92%	8%	
Support and integrate access to technology. (n=77)	56%	41%	3%



Waterdown PIC engagements, n=28 (avg)






Public Information Centre – Visioning Results
